**AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION
REPEALING RESOLUTION 2019-64 THAT AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED
THE MAYOR AND PRESIDENT OF COUNCIL
TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH LEE KINSTLE GM SALES & SERVICE
FOR THE PURCHASE OF A 2020 CHEVROLET TAHOE PURSUIT
IN THE AMOUNT OF \$43,054.00 THROUGH THE STATE OF OHIO'S
DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES (DAS)
COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the Village of Mayfield has a continuing duty to the public to provide efficient and effective services to its residents; and

WHEREAS, at the September 23, 2019 Regular Meeting of Council, Resolution No. 2019-64 was passed authorizing the purchase of a 2020 Chevrolet Tahoe Pursuit unmarked unit from Lee Kinstle GM Sales and Service in the amount of \$43,054.00; and

WHEREAS, due to unforeseen circumstances, namely the United Auto Workers' strike against General Motors, the order for the Chevrolet Tahoe was unable to be fulfilled by the dealer because GM stopped taking all orders; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police was able to locate a 2020 Chevrolet Tahoe through another vendor at a cost lower than the original request; and

WHEREAS, Council deems it in the best interest to repeal Resolution 2019-64 in order to authorize the purchase of a vehicle from another vendor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Mayfield Village, Cuyahoga County, State of Ohio that:

SECTION 1. Resolution 2019-64 entitled "An Emergency Resolution authorizing the Mayor and President of Council to enter into a contract with Lee Kinstle GM Sales & Service for the purchase of a 2020 Chevrolet Tahoe Pursuit in the amount of \$43,054.00 through the State of Ohio's Department of Administrative Services (DAS) Cooperative Purchasing Program" is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. The Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution have been taken at open meeting of this Council; and

that deliberations of this Council and of its committees, resulting in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements including requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Mayfield Village, Ohio, for the reason that the order for the police vehicle was unable to be fulfilled. It shall, therefore, take effect immediately upon the passage by the affirmative vote of not less than five (5) members elected to Council and approval by the Mayor or otherwise at the earliest time allowed by law.
